## Rain Doesn't Dampen Anacostia Watershed Society Clean Up

More than 2600 volunteers braved a rainy day to clean up the Anacostia River

Bladensburg, MD, April 27, 2016 – More than 2600 local residents and dozens of corporate partners registered to participate in the Anacostia Watershed Society's Earth Day Clean Up and Celebration Saturday April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Individuals, families and corporate teams fanned out to more than 30 sites on foot, in canoes and on a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers work boat to gather trash from the river banks and parkland up and down the river.

As usual, the most prevalent form of trash were Styrofoam food containers and cups, and plastic water bottles. These common items, discarded by the side of the road, are flushed into the Anacostia River and its tributaries with every heavy rainstorm. Among the larger items fished out of the river by the volunteers included the remains of a loveseat, a truck cab, a mattress, used tires and even a toilet seat!

The annual Earth Day Cleanup and Celebration also marked the launch of the Anacostia River Heroes Award, which seeks to shine a spotlight on remarkable individuals who are taking action to make the Anacostia River fishable and swimmable by 2025. Each awardee will receive a \$1,000 honorarium from a fund established by a generous donor, and administered by the Anacostia Watershed Society.
